
Marshmallow Snowman

What You Need:

- -Mini marshmallows
- -Markers
- -Glue
- -Construction paper
- -Orange scrap paper
- -Scissors



How to Do It: Draw a snowman on the construction paper, including the face and buttons. Cut out a carrot nose from the orange scrap paper and glue onto the face. Outline the snowman's body with glue. 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Jingle Bells

These sweet little instruments will add a joyful homemade noise to your kid's rendition of "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer".

Good for ages: 3 and up

What you'll need:

- red, green and silver pipe cleaners
- small jingle bells

How to make it: Fold a pipe cleaner in half and thread it through the hook at the top of a jingle bell until it reaches the halfway point. Then, twist the two pipe cleaner ends together to make a hand holder. Repeat a few times until the kids have a handful of jingle bells.
