

# Dr Seuss Inspired Fish Canvas Painting



Happy Sunday everyone! How many of you know/heard of the saying “One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish?”

Are you stumped? Well – it’s the title of a Dr Seuss classic and one of my favorite childhood books. It’s also what inspired today’s craft post.

In honor of Dr Seuss’ birthday coming up on March 2nd – Lil Man got to help me in the making of this fish themed canvas. It’s almost a replicable of the “One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish” book cover. With a few simple steps & supplies – you can make one too!



Supplies:

- \* White Canvas
- \* Paint – Light Blue, Red, Yellow, Dark Blue, Green, Orange, White, Black
- \* Paint Brushes
- \* Baby Wipes
- \* Scrapbook Stickers
- \* Cute kid with hands



Directions:

1. First paint your canvas a light shade of blue. {or google an image of the Dr Seuss book cover and go with the original book colors}
2. Next I painted Lil Man's hands in each color and had him press them on the canvas for our "fish." The first fish was yellow; then two green; followed with a red fish and ending with a blue one.
3. Once you got the fish in place, let it dry completely.

4. To finish your fish canvas – add some fish features to the handprints {lips & eyes} and stick your scrapbook stickers on. If you want some reinforcement for the stickers – add a layer of Mod Podge over the stickers so they won't go anywhere.



For an added look, I painted on some bubbles in the water with white paint.

Don't forget to add your child's name/age on the back so you remember when it was made. For easy hanging – hot glue some ribbon on the back.
