#### **Parrot**

#### Materials Needed:

- 1 Toilet Paper Tube
- Construction Paper
- 6 Feathers (you can either buy or make your own!)
- 1 Pipe Cleaner
- Scissors
- Tape
- Glue
- Markers
- Hole Punch



#### **Instructions:**

- Wrap Construction Paper around the whole tube. Then, wrap a smaller piece of construction paper at the top of the tube- this will be the parrot's head. Also, you can make a colorful chest for your parrot
- Draw eyes on two small circles and glue those to your parrot's head, then cut out a triangle for your parrot's beak
- Tape 2 feathers to the sides of your parrot- 1 feather on each side, for your parrot's wings- then tape 1 feather to the top of the tube for the parrot's crest
- Gather the 3 remaining feathers to make a tale for your parrot by gluing the feathers together and then taping the feathers to the back of the tube
- Punch two holes on each side of your bird- where the wings are at, but at the bottom of the tube
- Wrap pipe cleaner through the two holes and twist the cleaner around your wrist to keep your parrot with you on your pirate adventures!

# Sock Rabbit

Are you and your child practically swimming in piles of unmatched socks? Celebrate spring -- and take care of a little spring cleaning -- with this creative craft that turns a single sock into an adorable rabbit.

# What You Need:

- Scissors
- Dry rice Rubber band
- 2 black craft poms pom
  - 1 pink pom pom Black yarn
    - Glue
- Ribbon
- Cotton ball

## What You Do:

- Have your child fill the sock with rice until it reaches the "neck" of the sock -- or the part of the sock that hits the ankle. ij
  - Help her tightly wrap a rubber band around the sock's neck.
  - Show her how to use scissors to make one long cut in the sock material above the rubber band. Voila! Now her rabbit has two long, floppy ears. 2.6
    - To make the eyes, have your child glue two black pom poms onto the 4
- rabbit's face. 8.7.65
- Let her glue the pink pom pom below the eyes to make an adorable nose for her rabbit.

  Now her rabbit is just missing a mouth. Help her cut two pieces of black yarn: one short and one long.

  Have her place the short piece of yarn vertically directly beneath the rabbit's nose.

  Help her glue the long piece of yarn under the short piece, curved into a happy smile.

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
