



Hooo, Hooo! Who Wants to Make an Owl?

The owls come out at night in the fall and here is a fun way your child can make their own owl to put on a branch right outside their window! Take a lunchbox size brown paper bag and let your child fill it up with newspaper or magazine pages that have been formed in balls. After the bag is full, almost to the top, close and fold the opening of the bag and staple or tape it shut. Then, use whatever materials you have at home—pieces of cardboard for wings, buttons for eyes, tissue paper for feathers- and help your child create all of the parts of an owl. They can glue or tape all of these features onto their paper bag. Now, go and find a branch on a tree outside your home to set the owl on. As soon as it turns dark, let your child use a flashlight to locate their owl in the night!
