



Friday, April 23rd is World Book Day!

Here are some activities picked just for you to celebrate this day!



Book Bingo: Create a bingo card with each square having a different type of book- a book about animals; a book with a girl in it; a book with a boy in it.. you get the idea! Every day, read at least one type of book on the card and let your child color the square that describes the book. Use the same color crayon until your child has a full row for BINGO and then use a different color for the next row!

Book Nook: There is nothing better than having a cozy space to curl up with a good book. Let your child create a book nook somewhere in your house and let them set it up with a comfy pillow, warm blanket, favorite stuffed animals or baby dolls, and some great books! Tell them to go their nook anytime they want to read alone. Sometimes you could surprise them with a fun snack to munch on while they are reading!

Read around the World: Visit your local library or check out Books by the Bushel's [culturally diverse book category](#) to share books with your child from all over the world. Use a world map or globe to show your child where the story takes place or where the characters in the story are from.

Bookworm Bookmark: Your local Dollar Store will have all the supplies you need to help your child make bookmarks for themselves and their friends! Craft sticks, pompom balls, googly eyes, and some glue is all you need! Let your child color the craft sticks and then glue a colored pom pom ball on one end. Add some goggly eyes and your child now has a fun bookworm bookmark to mark a special place in their favorite books!
